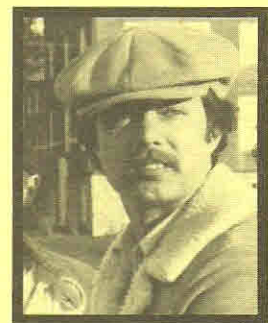

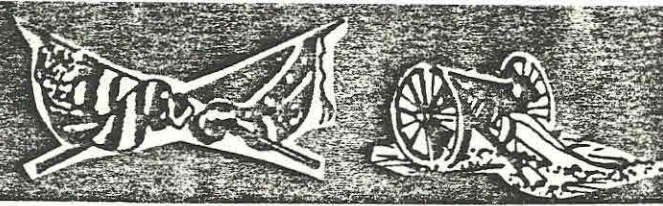

Antietam



The Bloodiest Day of the Civil War

The Battle of Antietam (or Sharpsburg) on September 17, 1862, climaxed the first of Confederate Gen. Robert E. Lee's two attempts to carry the war into the North. Some 41,000 southerners were pitted against the 87,000-man Federal Army of the Potomac under Gen. George B. McClellan. And when the fighting ended, the course of the American Civil War had been greatly altered.

After his great victory at Manassas in August, Lee had marched his Army of Northern Virginia into Maryland, hoping to find vitally needed men and supplies. McClellan followed, first to Frederick (where through rare good fortune a copy of the Confederate battle plan, Lee's Special Order No. 191, fell into his hands), then westward 12 miles to the passes of South Mountain. There on September 14, at Turner's, Fox's, and Crampton's gaps, Lee tried to block the Federals. But because he had split his army to send troops under Gen. Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson to capture Harpers Ferry, Lee could only hope to delay the northerners. McClellan forced his way through, and by the afternoon of September 15 both armies had established new battlelines west and east of Antietam Creek near the town of Sharpsburg. When Jackson's troops reached Sharpsburg on the 16th, Harpers Ferry having surrendered the day before, Lee consolidated his position along the low ridge that runs north and south of the town.

The battle opened at dawn on the 17th when Union Gen. Joseph Hooker's artillery began a murderous fire on Jackson's men in the Miller cornfield north of town. "In the time I am

writing," Hooker reported, "every stalk of corn in the northern and greater part of the field was cut as closely as could have been done with a knife, and the slain lay in rows precisely as they had stood in their ranks a few moments before." Hooker's troops advanced, driving the Confederates before them, and Jackson reported that his men were "exposed for near an hour to a terrific storm of shell, canister, and musketry."

About 7 a.m. Jackson was reenforced and succeeded in driving the Federals back. An hour later Union troops under Gen. Joseph Mansfield counterattacked and by 9 o'clock had regained some of the lost ground. Then, in an effort to extricate some of Mansfield's men from their isolated position near the Dunker Church, Gen. John Sedgwick's division of Edwin V. Sumner's corps charged headlong into the West Woods. There Confederate troops struck Sedgwick's men on both flanks, inflicting appalling casualties.

Meanwhile, Gen. William H. French's division of Sumner's corps moved up to support Sedgwick but veered south into Confederates under Gen. D. H. Hill posted along an old sunken road separating the Roulette and Piper farms. For nearly 4 hours, from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., bitter fighting raged along this road (afterwards known as Bloody Lane) as French, supported by Gen. Israel B. Richardson's division, also of Sumner's corps, sought to drive the southerners back. Confusion and sheer exhaustion finally ended the battle here and in the northern part of the field generally.

Southeast of town, Union Gen. Ambrose E. Burnside's troops had been trying to cross a bridge over Antietam Creek since 9:30 a.m. Some 400 Georgians had driven them back each time. At 1 p.m. the Federals finally crossed the bridge (now known as Burnside Bridge) and, after a 2-hour delay to reform their lines, advanced up the slope beyond. By late afternoon they had driven the Georgians back almost to Sharpsburg, threatening to cut off the line of retreat for Lee's decimated Confederates. Then about 4 p.m. Gen. A. P. Hill's division, left behind by Jackson at Harpers Ferry to dispose of the captured Federal property arrived on the field and immediately entered the fight. Burnside's troops were driven back to the heights near the bridge they had earlier taken. The Battle of Antietam was over. The next day Lee began withdrawing his army across the Potomac River.

It is said that more men were killed or wounded at Antietam on September 17, 1862, than on any other single day of the Civil War. Federal losses were 12,410. Confederate losses 10,700. Although neither side gained a decisive victory, Lee's failure to carry the war effort effectively into the North caused Great Britain to postpone recognition of the Confederate government. The battle also gave President Abraham Lincoln the opportunity to issue the Emancipation Proclamation, which on January 1, 1863, declared free all slaves in States still in rebellion against the United States. Henceforth the war had a dual purpose: to preserve the Union and to end slavery.

■ **Washington Monument State Park**—Built in 1827, this is the first monument to be erected in memory of George Washington. The monument was also used as a signal station during the war by the Union Army.

■ **South Mountain**—Battles between the Army of Northern Virginia and the Army of the Potomac were fought here and at Fox's Gap, and Crampton's Gap on September 14, 1862. The Southern Army fought delaying actions to give General Lee time to concentrate his forces and prevent the Union Army from defeating the Confederates piecemeal. The Union succeeded in driving the Southerners over South Mountain and on September 17th, the battle of Antietam was fought. At Fox's Gap, during the Battle of South Mountain, Union Major General Jesse Reno, Commander of the IX Corp was killed—the only Union General killed in action in Frederick County. In the same action at Fox's Gap, Brig. Gen. Samuel Garland of the Confederate Army was also mortally wounded. A monument to General Reno was erected in 1889 at a spot near where he was killed, by veterans of the IX Corps. The monument, now under the care of the National Park Service is on Reno Monument Road near the crest of South Mountain.

■ **Antietam National Battlefield**—Considered one of America's best preserved battlefields, Antietam was the site of the bloodiest battle in U.S. history. On September 17, 1862, more than 23,000 men on both sides were killed, wounded, captured or missing in General Robert E. Lee's first invasion of the North. A museum located in the park visitor center holds the panoramic battle paintings of Captain James Hope, Civil War veteran, and the award-winning 26-minute movie, "Antietam Visit." The eight and one-half mile driving tour highlights historic Dunker Church, Cornfield, Bloody Lane, Burnside Bridge, more than 350 monuments, tablets and markers, and 41 cannon. Also located on the grounds is the National Cemetery, the final resting place for 4776 Union soldiers (1,836 unknown) who met their fates at South Mountain, Antietam, Monocacy and other battles in the area.

■ **Antietam Aqueduct**—The aqueduct was built in 1834 by Irish immigrant labor, who died by the hundreds during a cholera epidemic. It is one of eleven aqueducts constructed to carry the C&O Canal across intersecting tributaries. As its name implies, this one carries the canal over the mouth of the Antietam. Troops in Gordon's division damaged the aqueduct, along with nearby canal boats and locks, on July 6, 1864.

One runner's triumph

WILLIAMSPORT — Bring a few hundred people together to compete in an event of extreme endurance and there is always a story of personal triumph somewhere amid the pack.

During Saturday's 28th annual John F. Kennedy 50-miler, David Horton, a 40-year-old director of physical education at Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va. was one such story.

Horton has run 63 of these ultramarathons — grueling events that take their participants through a topographer's dream of rugged terrain — finishing 57 and winning 28.

He finished No. 57 Saturday, coming in second place overall and establishing a record time of 6:16:39 for men 40 and over. They were significant achievements on a day of many noteworthy accomplishments. For Horton, though, the true achievement is that he was again able to run and compete successfully. It is like that for him every time he enters a race.

Horton suffers from ulcerated colitis, a condition that causes bleeding of the large intestine and anemia, among other problems. He was diagnosed with the disease last year and has since learned to cope with it as best he can.

"Just something that suddenly came up," he said. "No one is really sure how you get it or how you cure it."

There was a time when ulcerated colitis was considered life-threatening, but with the advancements of medicine it has since become another in a long line of treatable ailments.

But even under the best of circumstances, running and hiking 50 miles in just over six hours isn't what the doctor orders for someone with Horton's condition.

Still he does it and does it well.

His rationale for undertaking such a daring voyage is what you might expect from the institution where Jerry Falwell presides. Yet it works for Horton, and in this case, that is all that really matters.

"If God gives us a certain talent for something, then we should pursue that talent," he said. "I have no fear of death. I used to think maybe I would live a long life, but with this condition I don't think that I will. So I try to enjoy myself while I can, doing the things I like best. Competing in these types of events is one of those things."

And it isn't for the sake of competition alone that Horton does it. He is determined to win when he runs. There is no tale of sympathy here, because Horton feels none for himself. His physique is typical of the marathon runner, slim, yet well-defined (just try to pinch an inch). His zest for victory is equally sharp.

"Man, I thought I had a chance to win this thing today," he said. "I made a good push at the end, but it just wasn't to be. But you better believe I came in here looking to set the (40 and over) record. That was definitely a goal and it feels great to achieve it."

Joe Blackmon, a 28-year-old survey technician from Arnold, Md., took first place, finishing in 6:15:53, just under a minute better than Horton.

"I don't know where he came from," said Blackmon. "I thought I had a pretty good lead and then at the end, I look over my shoulder and there he is."

Horton's 16-year-old son Brindon was along for the race, not running, just offering words of encouragement to his father as the miles began stretching into eons. Horton motivated himself, as well, maintaining the thoughts he often does when he faces a difficult challenge.

"There's so much we take for granted that we lose track of just how fortunate we are," he said. "Just being able to walk to the starting line today is a blessing. Those are the sort of things I think about a lot."

Like it does to many others, life has taken its share of hard blows at Horton. But he returns the salvos with a smile on his face and the power of mind over matter. His next objective is to run and hike the entire Appalachian Trail in under 60 days.

Competing in marathons is his way of proving all is not as bad as it sometimes seems.

"I have so many positive things going for me that I don't have time to dwell on the negatives," said Horton. "I have a great family, I truly enjoy my job, and I can run. If I die today, I'll die a happy man. What else is there to ask for?"
