

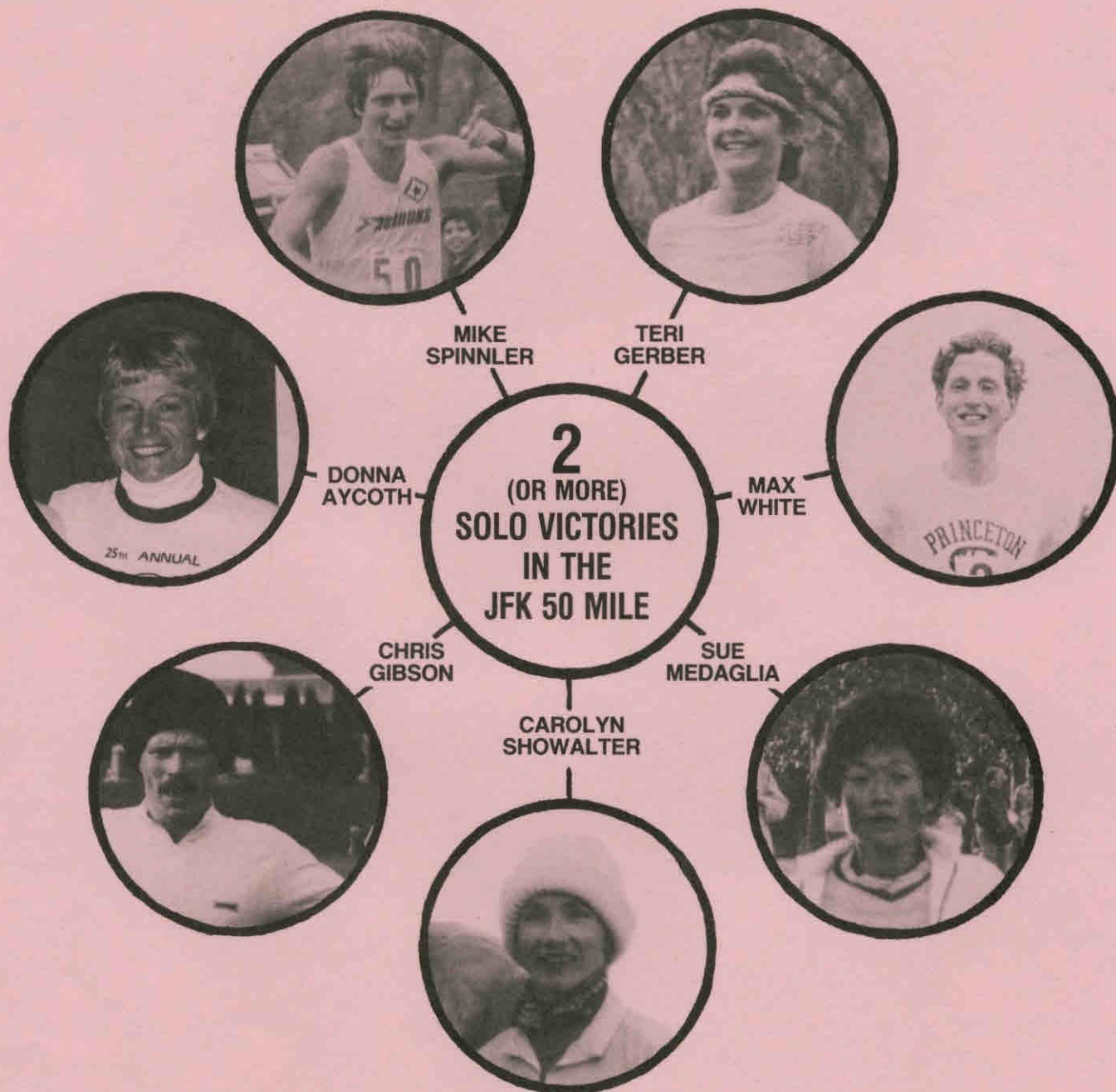

Competition and camaraderie in 50-mile JFK can warm heart of coldest runner

BOONSBORO

THERE WERE MORE than 350 people standing in the middle of the athletic field gyrating to stay loose or keep the chill off as daylight broke. The race was due to start at 7 a.m., but by 6:58 most gave indication they couldn't wait another two minutes, so race director Buzz Sawyer shrugged his shoulders, fired the gun and sent them packing.

The crowd surged forward, jumped down a little grassy knoll and took a left onto the main drag into town. Rising up on the left came the time/temperature clock out in front of a bank. It said the temperature was an invigorating 33 degrees. Now the JFK 50-mile hike-run was definitely under way.

No. 27 was a classic, but more on that in a bit.

From the starting point at the high school, competitors swoop through town and head up a long winding grade 3 miles where they take leave of Alternate Route 40 and duck into the woods. Welcome to the Appalachian Trail.

For the next 13-plus miles, the going is alternately rugged, relaxing, swift, slow, soft, hard, straight, winding, anything your little heart desires . . . and your feet, legs and lungs can take.

The JFK is a marvelous undertaking, but only to the people who know about it, an extremely faithful bunch.

Mike Adams, for instance. He finished the "Walk in the Woods" in 7:26:49 and that's the 21st time he's stayed the course, same as Kim Byron. Meanwhile, Cal Mahaney held onto the record for consecutive finishes with 20.

About halfway along the trail and after a sudden elevation drop of about 200 feet, there's a clearing and a chance at some water. That's usually the first time the leaders look around and take stock of the situation. The man setting the pace is rarely more than a couple of body widths ahead. The long panting line moves on.

The jumps over rocks, over fallen trees and quick moves ahead when the terrain permits are the preliminaries. The racing and jockeying for position starts when the adventurers alight from the woods and enter the towpath along the Potomac River.

For the next 25 miles, there's the silent river on the left, the rustle of leaves on the right and the gray crushed stone underfoot. There's lots of time to monitor the body, take on water at the check points and feel the rush of adrenaline at the sight of fellow humans every so often.

Chris Gibson, bidding to become only the third man to post repeat victories in the event started in the early '60s when President John F. Kennedy pleaded with America to get in shape, pushed ahead to a substantial lead along the path.

During the last few miles along the river and before the course turned up at Dam No. 4 and onto a country road, however, Ed Boggess came on strong. With less than 4 miles to go to the finish in Williamsport, Gibson led by just 25 yards.

He assessed his situation, questioned his resolve and pulled away smartly, winning by nine minutes. Boggess and 37 others arrived at the finish line in under eight hours. In the group were two women, defending champion Carolyn Showalter and a challenger all the way from Colorado, Randi Bromka.

Their effort was the story of this race and, undoubtedly, takes over as the showpiece for the long and storied history of the race.

Bromka, a strong runner who had run a 50-miler out west this summer in 6:52, had a substantial lead with about 5 miles to go. Still, Showalter was closing the gap ever so slightly with every step.

As the women came into sight of the finish line with about a quarter-mile to go, Bromka appeared to have enough to see her task through. But she was dog-tired and spent, every step painful and slower and slower in coming. Showalter, seeing a weakness in her rival for the first time all day, pushed harder.

About 150 yards from the finish, Bromka lost first place for the first time since 7 o'clock in the morning. It was nearly 3 o'clock in the afternoon. Showalter won in 7:52:44, her sixth victory tying the women's record for the event formerly held by Donna Aycoth.

Bromka struggled to 7:53:06. She collapsed in total exhaustion one step beyond the wire. A little later, she thought of coming all the way from Aspen, Colo., only to be turned back 150 yards from success. Could anyone ever have more motivation to return in 1990 to put things right?

A total of 289 competitors were able to beat the 14-hour cutoff time. Among them was Everett Marsh. Ev is an outdoor guy who retired about 15 years ago and moved from the Baltimore area to Frederick to be closer to the Appalachian Trail. He ran his first JFK at age 60 and, this weekend at age 74, completed the course for the 15th straight time. It is assumed this is what Kennedy had in mind when he issued his challenge.

Race director Sawyer considered it Valhalla when two dozen runners completed the course in under eight hours last November. "This year's total of 39 is just, just," he gasped, unable to come by the word.

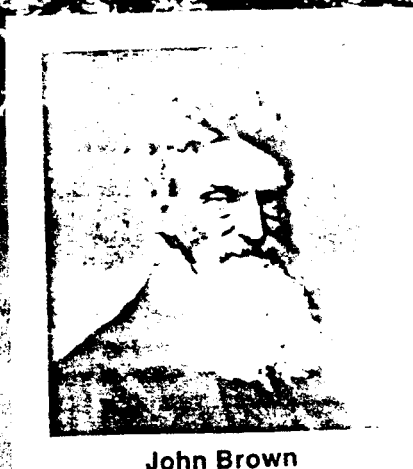

HARPERS FERRY

WEST VIRGINIA

The Railroad Trestle Bridge leading to Harpers Ferry, West Virginia, is 18.4 miles from the JFK 50 Start, and participants will pass underneath as the course leads them along the C & O Canal Towpath.

Harpers Ferry, situated on a point of land at the confluence of the Shenandoah and Potomac Rivers and dominated by the Blue Ridge Mountains, was a beckoning wilderness in the early 1700s. By mid-19th century the area contained some 3,000 inhabitants and the town itself had become an important arms-producing center and transportation link between east and west. John Brown's 1859 raid and the Civil War thrust the town into national prominence. The destruction wrought by the war and repeated flooding was responsible for the town's eventual decline.

The first European settler on this land was Peter Stephens, a trader, who came here in 1733 and set up a primitive ferry service at the junction of the two rivers. Fourteen years later, Robert Harper, a millwright and the man for whom the town is named, settled here, taking over Stephens' ferry operation. Seeing the waterpower potential, he later built a mill. The ferry and the mill have long since disappeared.

Within a century, Harpers Ferry developed from a tiny village into an industrialized community. The town received its first real impetus in the 1790s when President George Washington urged Congress to establish a national armory here along the Potomac. The armory supported the economy of the town and encouraged the establishment of small industries on adjacent Virginus Island. The arrival of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad in the 1830s assured Harpers Ferry of the economic success it was to enjoy well past mid-century.

Then came disaster. In October 1859 John Brown's raid jarred the peaceful town, and the civil war that followed 18 months later was to leave a path of destruction that wrecked the town's economy. The armory and arsenal buildings were burned in 1861 to keep them from falling into Confederate hands. Because of the town's geographical location and its railway system, Union and Confederate troop movements through Harpers Ferry were frequent, and soldiers of both armies occupied the town intermittently throughout the war. The largest military operation against Harpers Ferry occurred prior to the Battle of Antietam in September 1862 when Confederate forces under Gen. Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson seized the town and captured the 12,500-man Union garrison commanded by Col. Dixon Miles.

Discouraged by continual war damage and the lack of employment, many townspeople moved away. When some of these returned after the war to begin life anew, any hopes they might have had for the town's economic revival were dashed by a series of devastating floods in the late 1800s. For years following, empty buildings stood in silent desolation and once-active industrial sites were slowly reclaimed by nature.

The one bright hope in the story of Harpers Ferry after the Civil War was the establishment of a normal school for the education of freed blacks. The first classroom of what was to become Storer College was located in the Lockwood House, an abandoned armory dwelling above the town. The college remained in operation until 1955.
